ALANUS DE RATHERIFF (or Alan de Ratrief)
 lived during the reigns of William the Lion and Alexander II
 d. ca 1212 buried Rathray

Christian of Abernethy

SIR THOMAS DE RATHRIEF
 knighted by Alexander III
 Paid homage to Edward I in 1296
 m. 1253 thus acquiring part of the
 lands of Glencaveryn and Kingoldrum
 in Forfarshire

EUSTACE (or Eustatius)

John

SIR ADAM

in 1292, with other Scots baron was compelled to submit to Edward I (mentioned both in Pryme's Collections and Rymer's Fadera. In 1296 he was again forced to swear allegiance to the English king. One of the signatories of Ragman Roll in 1296. died before 1315

ALEXANDER

one of the barons of the parliament held at Ayr in 1315 to settle the succession to the crown.
 died issueless

EUSTACE (or Eustatius)

in the parliament of Perth, August 1320, was falsely accused of being concerned in the conspiracy of Sir William Soules and Sir David Brechin against Robert the Bruce, but fairly acquitted.

SYLVESTER

 the shire in which his lands were situated, but
 found it impossible, because, as the writ bears,
 the earl of Athol 1522 and his friends are
 "magnae potestatis et fortitudinis" in that town.
 He applied, in consequence, to King James V,
 and obtained from his majesty a commission
 under the great seal to have service done at
 Dundee, dated at Edinburgh 17 October 1533.
 He was accordingly served heir to his father and
 two brothers in the barony of Craighall and
 Kynballoch, and infert therein in Dundee in
 1534.

Upon his own resignation, got a charter under the great seal from Charles I, dated 28 February

1648 of the lands of Craighall, Kyneshalloch, and others, containing a Novodamus, and erecting them into a free barony, to be called Craighall and Rattray, in all time coming
